Cord Blood Banking

Cord blood banking (CBB) is something we will discuss with you during your pregnancy. There are many reasons people choose cord blood banking. Our staff will be happy to discuss the pros and cons of banking to help you decide if CBB is the right decision for you.

The American Congress of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOG) offer important facts for you to understand regarding CBB:

- CBB is not part of your routine obstetrical care and is not medically mandated.
- Many people view CBB as an "insurance policy" for peace of mind. This is based on research which is continuing to discover certain diseases may be treated with stored CBB from delivery. However, ACOG does not recommend routinely storing CBB solely as an "insurance policy" against future diseases.
